For this assignment, assume that your client lives in your geographical region. Refer to the text, "Garden Design" to help you complete this assignment.

Client Scenario:

Your client, Cecilia, has hired you to develop a landscape design for her property, shown below.



Cecelia has a lovely craftsman style home but her backyard lacks a softscape design. She'd like you to design several gardens for the backyard along the shed and along the fence. These areas receive a lot of direct sunlight. The garden design should complement the architecture of Cecelia's home. She would like for the garden to be fairly low maintenance. However, she is willing to spend an hour or so a week on garden upkeep. Cecelia would like to grow some of her favourite herbs, including basil and mint, but she doesn't want a vegetable garden. She doesn't have any particular flowers in mind for the garden, but her favorite color is purple. Although Cecelia would like the yard to include several gardens, she doesn't want the yard to appear crowded. Cecelia is working with a midrange budget.
